Staying Safe And Sound

As we know, our everyday safety starts with each of us looking out for each other. While preparing for the holidays and the many activities and celebrations that come with them, please remember that helping to keep things safe in Summerlin is an on-going shared responsibility between each of us and the Las Vegas Metro Police Department (Metro). The following information is some of Metro's valuable advice regarding home and community safety.

Keep Garage Doors Closed – A majority of property thefts that take place are attributed to people leaving their garage doors open while unattended. Metro notes reports of cars, bikes, golf clubs, and other valuables disappearing while residents go back

inside their home or in the back yard while leaving garage doors open.

Always Lock Your Car – Whether you park your car in your garage or on the driveway or street, (garage please, thanks!) it is important that you keep your car locked at all times and valuables out of sight. In addition to the potential loss of your vehicle, access to your home or garage by theft and use of your garage door opener is a pattern commonly seen by Metro.

Reporting Suspicious Behavior – Metro often shares that if you notice something that strikes you as somewhat unusual, it probably is. If you witness something in your neighborhood out of the ordinary, such as vehicles wandering through with no apparent destination or new faces

Chill Out Your Landscape Watering This Winter

Time to make the switch! Change your watering clock for the winter season. With cooler temperatures settling in, winter watering restrictions are in effect from November 1 through February 28. It's the perfect opportunity to save water when landscapes need less. Do your part to help protect our precious water supply!

During the winter season, sprinkler irrigation is limited to one assigned day per week; watering is prohibited on Sunday year-round.

The colder weather also benefits water-efficient plants and trees on drip irrigation systems, which can survive and even thrive when you water them just one day a week or less!

Avoid overwatering your landscape and keep your landscape healthy in the cold months by following these tips:

- Water during the mid-morning hours to avoid freezing and prevent ice from forming on lawns and sidewalks.



- Change the time on your irrigation clock to coincide with the end of Daylight-Saving Time on Sunday, November 3.
- Turn your irrigation clock off on rainy days.
- Follow the seasonal watering restrictions year-round to help you save up to \$300 annually on your water bills.
- Avoid costly fines! Watering on unassigned days or allowing water to flow off your property may result in a water-waste fee starting at \$80. So, chill out and don't waste water!

A cash drop scam occurs when a suspect (or suspects) drops money, often a \$20 bill typically in the self-checkout area. As a distraction to pickpocket the victim, they observe their PIN number.

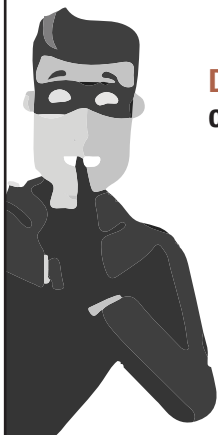
Always stay visually aware of your surrounding, especially in parking lots and check-out areas.

Be aware of who is around you when you are at a self check-out or at a store check-out register.

Do not allow people to watch you enter debit card pin numbers or credit card information.

Avoid close contact with anyone trying to get your attention or asking you to pick up cash dropped on the floor.

Do not display valuable items, such as cash or jewelry, openly or in an exposed purse.

Whether you want to brush up on your skills or just play for fun, ping pong will help you to make memories around the table and get a good workout at the same time. 🍁

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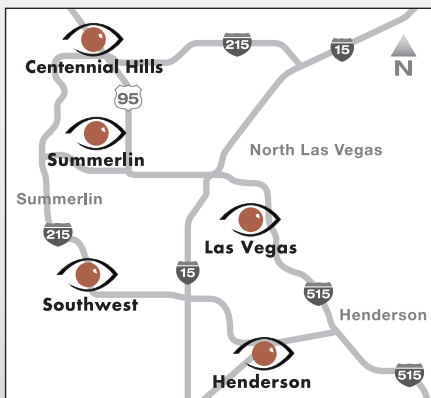


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
