Street Parking - This tends to be a sensitive issue in the community. Every effort should be made to organize your garage to accommodate as many vehicles as was originally designed. Excess vehicles should be parked on

the driveway. Parking on the street is highly discouraged and, if you are in a sub-association, you may have more strict rules and regulations. For your neighbors' sake, please make a habit of first using your garage and then driveway for your vehicles. The safety and appearance of your neighborhood will be much improved.

Vehicle Maintenance - Working on your vehicle must be confined to the garage with the garage door closed. GARAGE DOORS are to be kept closed except for reasonable ingress/egress.

**Pet Owners** - One of the more frustrating communitywide issues is irresponsible residents walking their pets unleashed. Please remember that dogs and cats must be leashed when not contained in the house or yard. In addition, pets should be kept quiet within reason both day and night and all residents must always clean up after their pets.

Boats, Campers, Trailers, Recreational Vehicles - Should not be parked on the driveway or on the street for more than 24 hours.

**Property/Exterior Appearance** - Our dry, hot climate can be hard on the exterior paint and other material surfaces of your home. Please make a habit of walking the exterior of your home a couple of times a year to identify and repair any items that need attention.

Submit For All Exterior Changes/Improvements - You must submit to your respective Design Review Committee prior to starting any exterior changes/improvements. All additions such as landscaping, sheds, pools, patios, patio covers, gazebos, rolling shutters, solar screens, house color changes, string/bistro lighting etc. require approval by the Association. This review process allows the Association to provide fellow members with comfort that all improvements will meet or exceed the community's uniform standards. Please note that the City of Las Vegas, Clark County and your sub-association may have additional requirements for you to satisfy.

By embracing these common-sense day-to-day practices in the community, Summerlin will continue to reflect the joy we all take in its appearance. Thank you all for vour efforts.







## Victim Of, Or Witness To Criminal And/Or Suspicious Activity

Have you heard the saying, "If a tree falls in the woods and there is no one there to hear it, does it make a sound?" Well, the same can be said when it comes to crime or other suspicious activity. If it takes place and no one takes the time to officially report it, no investigation can take place. Please know that LVMPD covers the valley in 10 divided jurisdictions, with your Summerlin Area Command covering approximately 78 square geographic miles. With limited resources, priority must be placed on actual reported incidents to support the allocation of these resources.

If you find yourself the victim of a crime, there are many reasons to report it to LVMPD and allow us to respond and investigate it appropriately. The benefits include, but are not limited to the following:

• Increases the chance of us apprehending the suspect(s)





by gathering evidence and potentially identifying the offender(s).

- If it is a property crime, a report can help track down and recover stolen belongings (especially if you have serial #'s or other identifying information for them).
- You may not be the first or the last victim of this activity. By reporting it properly, you may help prevent others from being victimized by the same suspect(s) or similar activity.
- Contributes to data collection and statistical reporting that can help influence the justice system. This is in terms of laws, policy making decisions, law enforcement funding/staffing levels, and the allocation of our limited resources to positively affect your community.
- Gives you access to victim support services provided to help you recover in a multitude of ways (legal support and assistance, counseling, etc.)

In today's virtual world, many feel by sharing via group texts, or posting it to online social media platforms they are "reporting" it. By only sharing it in those ways, you can be creating fear, spread misinformation, or even create disharmony and confusion within your community. It is best to report it to us and let our Officers and personnel do their duties accordingly.

How should you report incidents?

- To report an actual EMERGENCY call 911 (this would be for any crime that is occurring in the moment, is about to occur, or just occurred and the suspect(s) is still in the area)
- To report a non-emergency call 311 if you need a police response and there is no further threat to loss damage to a person or property.
- Visit any LVMPD Area Command during business hours to report many crimes that have already taken place and do not require a response to the scene. Our lobby is open Monday thru Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., excluding Official Holidays.
- Some reports can be filed online at www.lvmpd.com.
   Click on "Services" and then "File Report Online."
   Lastly, always remember, if you see something, do
   something and report it appropriately.



#### SUMMERLIN SOUTH COMPLIANCE **PROCEDURES**

There are predominantly two documents that define the L Community Wide Standards for Summerlin South. These are the Supplemental Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Reservation of Easements, which contain the use restrictions, and the Design Guide*lines and Standards* that provide guidance to homeowners wishing to make improvements and modifications to the exterior of their homes or their landscaping. These documents are provided to each purchaser at the time they close escrow on their homes. In addition, some can be found online at summerlink.com. Click on the "Homeowners" button at the top, and then "Summerlin South Community Association."

In order to provide the due process *required under* Nevada Law, if a violation of the Summerlin South Governing Documents is suspected, the steps available to the association to achieve resolution are:

- Friendly neighbor-to-neighbor contact which often will resolve the matter quickly and easily. If such contact is unproductive, deemed to be unwise, or inappropriate, then:
- Violations must be reported in writing. Visit summerlink.com, scroll to the very bottom and select "Contact Us," then "Community Complaint Form."
- If the violation is verified, a Courtesy Letter will be sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected within ten (10) days of receipt of the Courtesy Letter, a First Warning Letter is sent to the violator.
- If the violation is repeated or uncorrected 10 days after the mailing of the First Warning, the matter is referred



- to those Summerlin South residents who serve on the Compliance Committee.
- The Compliance Committee will schedule a hearing and invite the violator to attend and present his/her response.
- If the Compliance Committee is satisfied with the response, it may decide to drop the matter entirely.
- If the Compliance Committee is not satisfied with the response, it may assess a monetary penalty as allowed pursuant to NRS 116.
- If the violator is assessed a monetary penalty, the decision may be appealed to the Board of Directors, whose decision is final.

## New Service Line Warranty Program

As a homeowner in Southern Nevada, you know water leaks are bound to happen. To help you better afford repairing costly service line water leaks, the Las Vegas Valley Water District (LVVWD) is introducing a new program to help make it easier to find and repair costly leaks and save our precious natural resources.

The LVVWD developed the Service Line Protection Warranty Program in partnership with American Water Resources, an Oncourse company, to provide water service line protection at a significantly discounted rate. The proram covers repair costs for service line leaks and breaks that occur between the home and the water meter.

Through this program, District customers pay a monthly premium starting at \$3.99 for the first three years. The first 50,000 customers who enroll in the program will be fully reimbursed for the first year of service (\$47.88) by the LVVWD. It's important to note that LVVWD does not



receive any financial compensation from this program, but rather created this partnership solely to help its customers avoid the high cost of service line repairs, which can exceed \$3,000.

Research shows that homes more than 20 years old are significantly more likely to experience service line leaks than newer properties. This expense can lead to delayed repairs, which results in more water lost to leaks and, in time, drives up the customer's water bill.


